FOREIGN MINISTER PÉTER SZIJJÁRTÓ AND AMBASSADOR KUMAR TUHIN ATTEND KIS CHEMICAL'S EVENT IN SAJÓBÁBONY



Hungary's Minister of Foreign Affairs and Trade Péter Szijjártó and Ambassador Kumar Tuhin attended the opening event of Kischemicals Manufacturing Company in Sajóbábony. Kischemicals, an Indian company, is developing its factory in Sajóbábony with an investment of more than EUR 32 million. With the expansion of the factory producing plant protection products and intermediates, i.e. agrochemicals, the company can meet the growing needs of customers. The project to be completed by the end of 2023 will create many new jobs. Speaking at the event Minister



Péter Szijjártó said India and Hungary share very close ties, India is among the top investing nations in Hungary and Indian companies contribute to employment generation, skills addition and technology accretion in Hungary. Mr. Gaurav Astik, Director of Kischemicals, spoke at the function outlining

ASCC WEBINAR IN MEMORY OF AMRITA SHERGIL

The Amrita Sher-Gil Cultural Centre organized a webinar on Dec 4th to mark the 79th death anniversary of Amrita Shergil. The programme was formally opened by Ambassador Kumar Tuhin, who spoke about the indelible contribution of the young painter in connecting the art history of India and Hungary. This was followed by the keynote address by art historian and writer Dr. Katalin Kesuru who shared her experiences about the exhibitions and art panorama of Amrita that she had the privilege to curate. During the webinar, a 25 minute film was shown on the life and works of Amrita.



Dancer Panni Somi and Actor Navjot Randhawa shared their impressions about the artist who they had created on stage. Katalin Ladik the director of the play 'Everything she wants: Amrita and Boris' shared her experience of creating a timeless musical play with the role of Amrita played by Navjot. Writer Edina Stanczik threw light on her journey of exploring the life of Amrita while writing her book on Istvan Szekely, relative of Amrita Shergil. Ms.Olga Maloney art director of Billingham International Folklore Festival of World dance, shared her experience about her project 'The Two Fridas', where she juxtaposed both Frida Kahlo & Amrita Sher-gil through paintings, dance and drama. The webinar

was concluded by Ms. Margit Koves, Professor of Hungarian language at Delhi University, who gave a rare presentation of letters, sketches and poetry of Amrita Shergil.

INDIAN FILM FESTIVAL LAUNCHED IN HUNGARY AND BOSNIA & HERZEGOVINA

In the presence of notable films makers from India, the 6th Indian Film Festival in Hungary was virtually launched on Dec 7th. In view of the pandemic situation, unlike last few years, this year' film festival was launched on two Hungarian TV Channels, Hatoscsatorna TV and Szeged TV. Ambassador Kumar Tuhin welcomed all the filmmakers who had partnered with the Embassy of India to make this year's Indian Film Festival a successful event and



emphasized the need to connect with the Indian films in order to know more about India. Eminent filmmaker Madhur Bhandarkar joined the launch with his critically acclaimed film, 'Indu Sarkar'. He expressed his pleasure at being a part of this novel initiative to have the festival on television, when audiences are unable to come physically to watch the



Indian films in the theatres of Hungary. Besides Indu Sarkar, the other films that were shown on Hatoscsatorna TV and Szeged Tv were bollywood blockbuster 'Saaho', Indo-Argentinian production 'Thinking of Him' based on Rabindranath Tagore's Argentina visit, 'Jhalki' and 'The Silence' both giving strong social messages. Preceding the virtual ceremony both the TV channels invited Ambassador for an in depth interview on the aim and benefits of having a film festival on Hungarian TV Channels.
