Speech by Ambassador Shri Anshuman Gaur on the ITEC Day Celebration, Budapest

3rd October 2025

In recent years, we have embraced digital innovation through **e-ITEC**, offering live online courses to ensure that the flow of knowledge continues uninterrupted. The curriculum has expanded beyond traditional subjects to include cutting-edge fields such as Artificial Intelligence, cybersecurity, sustainable development, renewable energy, and nano-technology. This ensures that our partner countries are equipped with the skills needed to navigate the complexities of the 21st century. From judicial training in New Delhi to solar energy technology in Rajasthan, ITEC offers a diverse and world-class learning experience, hosted at India's premier institutions.

Each year, hundreds of professionals are trained under ITEC, returning to their home countries not just with new expertise, but with a deeper understanding and appreciation of India. They become bridges between our cultures, and we affectionately call them our "ITEC Ambassadors."

Our celebration today is made truly special by the presence of our Hungarian ITEC alumni. Hungary has been a valued partner in the ITEC program for many years. We are delighted that dozens of Hungarian professionals, experts, and officials have participated in various specialized courses across India. They have returned not just with new skills and knowledge but with a deeper understanding and appreciation of India's culture and diversity.

You, our alumni, are the living bridges between our two nations. You are the true ambassadors of the India-Hungary friendship. The experiences you have shared and the networks you have built are invaluable assets that strengthen the very fabric of our bilateral relationship. We are immensely proud of your achievements and your contributions to Hungary's progress. We look forward to welcoming many more participants from Hungary in the coming years.

The spirit of ITEC perfectly mirrors the broader relationship between India and Hungary—a relationship built on a foundation of mutual respect, shared democratic values, and a rich history of cultural connections.
