4. Important India related statements of commercial significance by political leaders, think tanks, chambers, associations etc. / Significant stories/features on India related trade, investment, services and logistic sector, published in foreign journals/dailies, etc.: (Max. 500 words)

- Meeting with HEPA: On 16th July 2019, Commercial Representative of the Mission visited the Hungarian Export Promotion Agency the, successor of the Hungarian National Trading House and met Mr. Gabor Fényes, Head of Foreign Missions who informed that there is a new structure to the agency and all Trading House offices were closed, including in India. The relatively new agency would operate regional partner offices in Japan, China and Turkey, who would look after neighbouring countries exploring opportunities of local markets on request to HEPA. It was understood that India is a huge growing market with ample opportunities. Therefore, HEPA is also contemplating the country as venue to open new partner offices. It was also said that individual states would be in the focus for Hungarian entrepreneurs.
- Hungary, India Water Purification Project Concluded: Hungary's Pannon University in Veszprém and the Energy and Resources Institute of India have concluded a three-year natural water purification project, the University of Veszprém said. They have developed a technology capable of removing bioactive antibiotics, hormones, drug residues and phenolic derivatives present in small quantities in industrial wastewaters and surface waters. The project was implemented between July 1, 2016 and June 30 2019 under a Hungary-India research and development cooperation scheme. It was supported by Hungary's National Research, Development and Innovation Office with a 28.7 million forint (EUR 88,000) grant.

- 1. Visit of Chairman and Secretary of Railway Board on 23-25 June 2019: A two-member railway delegation consisting of Mr. V.K. Yadav Chairman and Mr. Sushant Kumar Mishra, Secretary, Railway Board, Ministry of Railways, Government of India visited Hungary on 23-25th June 2019 to participate in the 94th General Assembly of the International Union of Railways in Budapest. As part of the programme, the delegation visited the Eastern Railway station and had discussions with experts and viewed a number of best practices used in public railway services. The delegation appreciated the advanced technologies and solutions used by the Hungarian State Railways, MAV. Ambassador hosted a lunch for the delegation.
- 2. EC warns on deviation from budgetary objective: The European Commission again warned Hungary that it may be significantly deviating from the adjustment path toward the medium-term budgetary objective. The EC issued a similar warning in June of last year. The structural budget deficit of Hungary amounted to 3.7% of GDP in 2018, up from 3.4% in 2017. The 3.7% was over the 2.4% required target. The EC is recommending a one percentage point cut in the structural deficit in 2019 and further 0.75 percentage point reductions in 2020.
- 3. 5% economic growth confirmed: The economy expanded by 5.2% in the first quarter year-on-year, and by 1.5% from the last quarter of 2018, the Central Statistics Office reported.
- **4.** Embassy of India, Budapest celebrated the **5th International Day of Yoga and Cultural Festival** in 17 cities in Hungary.
- 5. Ft 260bn for tourism projects: Development funds available for tourism under the Széchenyi 2020 program in the current EU's 2014-20 budget cycle will reach Ft 260 billion (appx € 805 mln), Innovation and Technology Ministry State Secretary Tamás Schanda said. The government, which sees tourism as a strategic sector, wants to increase the sector's contribution to GDP from 10% at present to 16% by 2030, he added. The government's aim is that Hungary should be the leading tourist destination in Central Europe by that time.

- 1. Ailing Aluminij Shuts Down Operations: Aluminij the largest Aluminum smelting company in BiH shut down its operations after recent talks on bailing it out between Bosnia's Federation government and potential investors failed, local media reported. The Federation government, Aluminij's largest shareholder, has been under pressure by potential investors and the company's management to subsidize the electricity price for the aluminum smelter. The government, however, has stressed it is no longer able of subsidizing Aluminij's electricity costs as the price for the taxpayer is too high. The company has been in persistent trouble over high prices of electricity and raw materials. Its outstanding debt has reached some 400 million KM (€ 205 mln), of which 280 million KM (€ 143 mln) owed to power utility Elektroprivreda HZHB in unpaid electricity bills. Aluminij employs 900 people and has numerous suppliers and other cooperating units, including Croatia's Adriatic port of Ploce, with the Mostar-based company engaging 20% of the port's capacities. The Federation government controls 44% of Aluminij, followed by the government of Croatia with 12%, with the remainder held by smaller shareholders.
- 2. Federation Banks Q1 Net Profit Rises 3.7%: The net profit of the banks operating in the Federation entity rose 3.7% year-on-year in the first quarter of 2019, reaching 89.9 million KM (€ 46 mln), the entity's banking agency, FBA, said. The total operating income of banks in the Federation rose 3.6% on the year to 106.8 million KM (€ 51.1 mln) in January-March, while operating costs increased 1.8% to 126 million KM (€ 64.4 mln). The banks' total net assets increased to 22.5 billion KM (€ 11.5 bln) as at end-March, up 1.6% compared to the end of 2018. A total of 14 banks operated in the Federation at the end of March. Mostarbased UniCredit Bank was the largest bank in the Federation in terms of assets at end-March, followed by Sarajevo-based Raiffeisen Bank and the Bosnian arm of Intesa Sanpaolo bank.
- 3. Indirect Tax Revenue Up 9% in January-May: Indirect tax revenue in Bosnia rose 9% on the year to 3.205 billion KM (€ 1.6 bln) in the first five months of 2019, the Indirect Taxation Authority said. Following VAT reimbursement to taxpayers, the five-month net revenue totaled 2.579 billion KM (€ 1.8 bln), up by an annual 8%, the tax authority said in a statement.
- 4. Economy Grew 3.62% in 2018: Bosnia's economy grew 3.62pc year-on-year in 2018, driven mainly by improved activity in the energy sector, agriculture, forestry and administrative services, the state statistics agency said in a flash estimate on Tuesday. National output totaled 33.4 billion KM at current prices in 2018 compared to an estimated 31.4 billion KM a year before.
