


AMBASSADOR MEETS FORMER PRIME MINISTER DR. PÉTER MEDGYESSY

Vande Bharat Mission (VBM) Phase 5 and 6



Under the Govt of India Vande Bharat Mission (VBM), more than 10 lakh persons have been evacuated to India so far. The schedule of Phase V flights may be seen at https://mea.gov.in/phase- 5.htm Phase VI of Vande Bharat Mission (VBM) is expected to commence from 1st September. To facilitate special evacuation flights on regular basis, Government of India has entered into Air Bubble Arrangement with many countries. Travellers in Europe can now travel to India via Germany and France, with Air India, Air France and Lufthansa flights. Tickets need to be booked by the persons directly on websites of airlines. From Hungary, more than 150 stranded Indians have already returned to India on VBM flights so far.

Entering India

Government of India has recently revised guidelines for travellers entering India. All travellers have to submit self-declaration form on the online portal www.newdelhiairport.in at least 72 hours before travel. Travellers can also seek exemption from institutional quarantine by submitting negative RT-PCR report on arrival. Test should have been conducted within 96 hours prior to undertaking the journey. Government of India has also allowed a few categories of visa holders to enter India. These include Diplomatic Visa, Official Visa, UN, Employment Visa, Project Visa, Business Visa, etc.

Entering Hungary:

Hungary has divided countries into green, orange and red zones on the basis of level of coronavirus cases in these countries for the purpose of regulating travel. It is expected to undergo a change w.e.f. September 1 as some travel restrictions are expected to be strengthened in view of spike in cases. The application must be submitted online, in Hungarian language to the Police who will than assess the request and decide to grant or deny entrance.
