The 'Raksha Bandhan' festival was celebrated in Hungary this year with great enthusiasm.





VANDE BHARAT MISSION (VBM) PHASE 6



Government of India's Vande Bharat Mission (VBM) continued with the announcement of Phase VI. Schedule may here: he seen https://mea.gov.in/phase-6.htm **Bharat** Vande Mission has reached out and facilitated international travel of 16.40 lakh stranded & distressed people, thus becoming one of the largest missions of its kind in recent times.

Travellers from Europe can now travel to India via Germany and France as per the "air bubble arrangement, on Air India, Air France and Lufthansa flights. Tickets need to be booked by the persons directly on websites of airlines. Ministry of Home Affairs, Government of India have issued guidelines for phased re-opening (Unlock 4.0) which will be in force upto 30th September, 2020, details can be checked here:

Entering India

Government of India has recently revised guidelines for travellers entering India. All travellers have to submit self-declaration form on the online portal www.newdelhiairport.in at least 72 hours before travel. Travellers can also seek exemption from institutional quarantine by submitting negative RT-PCR report on arrival. Test should have been conducted within 96 hours prior to the journey. Entering Hungary

Hungary has again introduced temporary border controls in view of the rising COVID-19 cases in Hungary. Any person entering Hungary has to undergo 14 days mandatory quarantine, in case a medical check reveals the suspicion of infection, the person concerned would be accommodated in a quarantine designated by the epidemiological authority, otherwise home quarantine. information can be checked http://www.police.hu/en/content/information-ongeneral-rules-of-border-crossing.
